

John B. Davies, M.D. joined the Retina Consultants of Minnesota (RCM) in 2009 and is certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology. He is a member of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the Minnesota Academy of Ophthalmology, and the American Society of Retinal Specialists. He is also an attending retinal surgeon at the Hennepin County Medical Center.

After graduating as the Salutatorian of his high school class, Dr. Davies was awarded a Bachelor of Science in biochemistry *magna cum laude* on an academic scholarship from the University of Rochester. During his time in Rochester he also studied piano at the Eastman School of Music and was a varsity cross-country and track athlete. He received his Doctorate of Medicine *cum laude* from Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia. He completed an ophthalmology residency at Emory and also served as Chief Resident. He pursued a fellowship in vitreoretinal surgery and disease at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis and the Barnes Retina Institute.

Dr. Davies is a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha National Medical Honor Society and Phi Beta Kappa. He is consistently recognized on the Top Doctors list by the Minneapolis / St. Paul Magazine. He received the Golden Apple Award for best teacher during his retinal fellowship at Washington University. At his college commencement he was honored to receive the Ayman Amin-Salem Memorial Award, presented to the member of the University of Rochester senior class who “best evidences the qualities of good character and good citizenship, such as decency, reliability, responsibility, and congeniality.”

Dr. Davies is actively engaged in training the next generation of retinal surgeons and currently serves as the co-director of the RCM Fellowship Program. He is active with the RCM research division and is an investigator for many clinical trials exploring new therapies for retinal disease. He has an impressive publication record and has delivered numerous invited lectures. Dr. Davies is on the Board of Directors of the VitreoRetinal Surgery Foundation, which supports research by young investigators at academic programs from all across the country. He also has served on the Board of Directors of the Minnesota Academy of Ophthalmology and previously was the Chief of Ophthalmology at Fairview Southdale Hospital in Edina, Minnesota.
